DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

If you see anything that is not normal, **please call 911 immediately**. You do not have to leave your name. We are working very closely with the 4th precinct and we need your help. Do not let a day or two go by before you call.

If you can give a description of a person(s) or vehicle that you have seen in the area, they will take the information and hold it, as it might help in other activities going on around our community and nearby subdivisions..

BUSINESS OFFICE HOURS

Remember our **Glenwood Office is open for business from MONDAY-FRIDAY from 9am-5pm**. If the Community Center is occupied other than during business hours, it is due to a private party, and the office is not open.

COMMUNITY MAILBOX

The mailbox is located at the front of the building, so that you will be able to drive up to it and drop off any items that you have for the office, including your assessment payments, without getting out of your car. Any association correspondence may be placed in the mailbox. It is checked daily.

RESIDENT MAILBOXES-

If your mailbox needs to be repaired or replaced. The Association office keeps PVC boxes in stock. The purchase price is \$79.00 (our cost). Checks can be made out to Glenwood Community Association.

We do not accept cash or credit cards.

MODIFICATIONS AND/OR ADDITIONS

Please remember to submit an ACC application prior to having any changes made on your property. This includes but is not limited to sheds, paint, roofs, room additions, etc. If you are uncertain as to whether or not an application is necessary, we would rather have you err on the side of caution and send one in. Please be sure to include all plats, plans, dimensions, color samples, etc. necessary to fully explain your change.

Thank you in advance for your assistance in resolving matters before a notice needs to be sent. If you have a question as to whether or not something is in violation, please do not hesitate to give the office a call.

REMINDERS-

BOATS- Boats cannot be kept within the Glenwood Community Association if they are (VFNP) Visible from Neighboring Property. If you can see the boat above the fence, it is visible and must be removed. The same criteria holds true for all RV's, trailers, (both covered and uncovered), etc. Please refer to the guidelines for clarification or call the office if you are unsure.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Summer is almost over, so this is a good time to look at your house and property to see what needs to be done, before Winter sets in. Is your siding covered in mildew? Is your mailbox rotting or in need of a coat of paint? Please look at your property from the perspective of a person buying the house next door. Would you want to live next to what you see? Maintenance includes the yard. Please keep your grass cut, bushes trimmed, beds weeded, and curbs clean. The Association has the right to perform work at your expense when your yard is not maintained.

TRASH CANS- must be removed from the street and placed either behind the rear foundation of the house, within a fenced yard, or in the garage no later than the evening of your collection day.

HELP KEEP OUR WATERWAYS CLEAN

Don't dump grease down your house drains. Place in an empty can and toss in the garbage.

Don't dump oil, gasoline, or other materials into the storm drains. Keep leaves, grass clippings, dirt, soaps, litter, pet poop, cigarettes and harmful chemicals from the streets, ditches and storm drains. These materials clog drainage systems, contribute to flooding and lead to harmful algae blooms and fish kills.

Don't litter or feed wild geese, ducks or seagulls, their droppings pollute our lakes and rivers with bacteria and excess nutrients.

Red Imported FIRE ANTS are Here!

Since making their way into the United States in the 1930's, Red Imported Fire Ants (RIFA) have continued to expand their territories. They are now a significant pest throughout the South.

According to the USDA Research Service, there are five times more ants per acre in the United States than in their native land of South America. While mostly prevalent in the southern coastal states, including Alabama, Louisiana, Georgia, Texas, Mississippi, Florida and South Carolina, RIFA continue to infiltrate to North and West. Researchers anticipate that the RIFA will continue to expand their presence in Tennessee, Oklahoma, Arkansas and move into portions of Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, New Mexico and Arizona.

In an effort to minimize the spread of RIFA, the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service has imposed restrictions on the movement of regulated materials from quarantined counties to into non-quarantined counties. Despite these efforts, the RIFA have made their way into Southeast Virginia. The Virginia Department of Agriculture has received many inquiries from Pest Management Professionals throughout our region. RIFA's are typically brought into this area on plants from infested regions. Infestations may be discovered in the landscaping next to the building or appear as mounds of soil in the middle of the yard. They can seemingly appear overnight, but in reality, they have been there for some time.

Fire Ants are more than just a nuisance. They attack in mass and will inflict a painful sting when disturbed. The characteristics of the RIFA mound are 1-4 feet in diameter, 4-12 inches high and irregular in shape. When the mound is disturbed, the ants will swarm over the person or animal and inflict multiple stings. Should you see any suspicious mounds, please report them to your Pest Management Professional immediately.
